9		Fluegge seconded. Passed unanimously.

11		Commissioner Lundh motioned to add the emergency comprehensive plan amendment to
12		the agenda. Commissioner Davis seconded. Passed unanimously.

25		CUP-2019-002 appeal notification
26		Planner Temple appraised the Commission about the status of the appeal and notified
27		them more information would be forthcoming. Planner Temple cautioned the
28		Commission against having outside communication about the project since it is in the
29		middle of the appeal.
30		Proposed Zoning text amendments
31		Planner Temple advised Commissioners that the City would prefer to move forward with
32		the planned and reviewed text and map amendments, which include amendments
33		clarifying the Planning Director vs City Planner references. Commissioner Hawk
34		motioned and Commissioner Lundh seconded, to accept the text changes as presented
35		and move forward with the amendments by the end of the year.
36		Emergency Comprehensive Plan Amendments
37		Planner Temple explained the reason for the emergency amendment was to remove the
38		zoning map (since it would generally be inconsistent) and modify the land use map to
39		include the land use designations discussed and previously approved for the UGA areas.
40		The only other edits were to correct the figure numbers correspondingly. The Planner
41		sent the amendment off to Commerce for the required 60-day state review to enable the
42		amendment to be adopted by the end of the year. There will be a hearing at the November
43		5 th Planning Commission meeting.
44		2020 Priorities
45		Planner Temple opened discussion of commitments made to focus on various policy for
46		2020. Code changes and fire adaptation.

Wildfire readiness/preparedness

Planner Temple described the Kittitas Fire Adapted Communities Coalition (KFACC) as an opportunity to determine what fire adaptation methods we could use. Temple explained that she and Councilperson John Glondo used to adapt, but have been unable to attend for months. Temple suggested people could meet with or talk to Rose Shriner of Perteet, who is staff to KFAC. Planner Temple provided examples of several ways the City could include fire adaptability in the code. Commissioner Malek summarized a meeting that took place recently at Basecamp Books, including some standards the firewising community suggests to create open space adjacent to buildings. Planner Temple talked about the firewising the DNR performed this year and last on City property, and what properties could happen in the next year. Temple also informed the Commission about the brush dump opportunities for the community during fall/spring cleanups and the challenges of getting the brush dump emptied after the community fills it up. Commissioner Clark discussed biofuel program examples. Planner Temple included discussion about WUI code and how the City could provide guidance to landowners who would like to firewise.

Planner Temple discussed definition of affordable housing and the term cost burdened. Temple reported that City staff were looking into what it would take to lift the regulations for separate utility meters for ADUs which would reduce the cost to the owner and the tenant for smaller more affordable units. Temple also talked about the difficulty of expecting developers to create affordable housing. Temple suggested looking into how to require larger developers to build or contribute to affordable housing. Temple supplied examples and reminded this is a large issue that can only be chipped away at. Temple suggested that this also be discussed in terms of impact fees.

Planner Temple reported anticipating applications and additional development proposals making October a busy month.
