Call to Order - Roll Call of Membership

The Regular meeting of the City Council was called to order by Mayor Jay McGowan at 6:00 p.m. The Piedge of Allegiance was recited. The Roll was called. A motion was made by Ken Ratliff and seconded by Matthew Lundh to excuse the absences of Steven Harper, Siw Bay-Hansen and Beth Williams. The motion carried unanimously.

#### Consent Agenda

A motion was made by Matthew Lundh and seconded by Ken Rutliff to adopt the consent agenda as presented. The consent agenda included the minutes of the 06/13/2022 Regular City Council meeting; the minutes to the 06/15/22 Special Study Session; and 06/27/2022 Claim Voucher EFTs and Checks #44580-44602 in the amount of \$182,437.00. #### Officer Reports

# City Administrator, Building Official, Network Administrator - Robert Omans - Reported:

- The Office of Financial Management (OFM) has estimated Cle Elum's population at 2,250, up from 2210 in 2021.
- The City continues to advertise for the City Planner position; no additional applications have been received.
- The City has added Police, Fire and Library to the TextMyGov app.
- Details on the July 4<sup>th</sup> Pioneer Days events can be found at UKCPioneerDays.org and on the City's website.

# Public Works Directors - Mike Engelhart - Reported:

- Crews have been painting crosswalks and parking stalls, weeding the planters and sweeping the streets.
- Invited members of the council to help with a cleanup event scheduled for 8 am on 06/28/2022. Cleanup targets will be Safeway Hill, Hartvig Boulevard and West Second Street.

# Police Chief - Kirk Bland Reported:

- The RFP for the vacated City Prosecutor position has been published. The deadline to respond is 07/18/2022; applications will be brought back to council on 07/25/2022.
- Officers have been busy with regular duties and will be out in full force over the 4th of July Cefebration. No personal fireworks will be allowed; however, the fireworks show sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce is still planned to take place, barring any potential fire/burn bans.

#### Planning Department Report:

• The Public Hearing on the Flood Prevention Ordinance was cancelled due to the lack of a quorum. This hearing will be moved to City Council.

- Due to the resignation of contract planner Meagan Hayes, the 06/21/2022 Planning Commission meeting was cancelled. The Critical areas checklist review and discussion on docketing items for the remainder of the year were scheduled for that meeting.
- The Planning Commission intends to discuss having only one meeting per month.
- The Planning Commission continues to recruit Cle Elum residents to fill the 2 vacancies.
- Key items on the 2022 checklist include the 2 docketed items, wildfire related policies and the change from the stat on affordable housing. Time permitting, the Planning Commission will begin review of the Comprehensive Plan.

#### Citizen Comments on Non-Agenda Items

Greg Gohsman – 2131 Lower Peoh Point Road: Commented the schools are filled to this capacity and a large development will require a new school. There is no funding for a new building and there are teacher and substitute teacher shortages; he recommended putting a stop on all new development permits. He also recommended consulting with the sheriff to see what their needs are.

## Chamber of Commerce - Matt Anderson:

- Reported Beth from the Liquor Control Board will be speaking at the BDC on 07/06/2022 about permitting when alcohol will be served.
- The Chamber is setting up a text messaging system where people can sign up for text alorts and updates on events.
- The Lemonade Days event has officially kicked off, with over 90 kids participating so far.
- The Pioneer Days Parage has 60 floats signed up to date, with the expectation of 20 more.
- The 3 on 3 Basketball tournament will begin at the conclusion of the parade on 07/02/2022.
- The Independence Day celebration will take place at Memorial Park on 07/04/2022, with beer gardens and other events. The fireworks show is scheduled to start at dusk.
- Acknowledged Debbic Bogart for her hard work getting events added to Pioneer Days.
   Cle Elum Downtown Association Debbie Bogart reported:
- Provided a video power point detailing the Main Street efforts in 15 communities around the state.

#### Unfinished Business - None

- a. Resolution 2022-013 Amending Resolution 2020-017 Procurement Policy: Robin Newcomb presented the updated version of the policy, per the council's request at the 06/13/2022 Council meeting. A motion was made by Matthew Lundh and seconded by Ken Ratliff to approve Resolution 2022-013 updating the Procurement Policy as presented. The motion carried unanimously.
- b. Resolution 2022-015 Employee Handbook Amendment: A motion was made by Matthew Lundh and seconded by John Glondo to pass Resolution 2022-015 amending the Employee Handbook as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

#### New Business

a. Potential Bid Award – Knobel Electric – First Street and Douglas Munro
Intersection Improvements - \$565,060.00: Mike Engelhart reported the original bid for this project is \$525,920, \$125,000 over the engineers' estimate. TIB has agreed to fund the additional \$125,000 at no cost to the city. A motion was made by Ken Ratliff and seconded by John

Glondo to accept the bid from Knobel Electric in the amount of \$565,060, to be supplemented by TIB in the amount of \$125,000. The motion carried unanimously.

b. <u>Purchase of Used Vac Truck:</u> Mike Engelhart explained a Vac Truck is an important piece of equipment, used in about 90% of the call outs for Public Works. For the Vactor truck currently owned by the City, John Deere motor repairs and/or replacement would be approximately \$200,000, and parts are at least 2 years out. A new truck will be about \$550,000. Engelhart advised council the city is looking for a replacement truck. If one is located, an emergency meeting will be called for approval.
